**RESOLUTION TEMPORARILY ALLOWING THE USE OF OUTDOOR EATING AREAS  
DURING THE BELMAR & LAKE COMO ST. PATRICK'S DAY PARADE  
FOR THE BOROUGH OF BELMAR, MONMOUTH COUNTY, NEW JERSEY**

**WHEREAS**, businesses in the Borough of Belmar may obtain approval from the Planning Board or Zoning Board of Adjustment (“Board”) for an Outdoor Eating Area, Outdoor Dining Area, or Sidewalk Dining Area (“Outdoor Eating Areas”) pursuant to Ordinance Section 40-7.8(h) of the Belmar Development Regulations, and, if approval is granted, the Outdoor Eating Areas may only be utilized from April 1 to November 1 of each year, per 40-7.8(h)(11); and,

**WHEREAS**, businesses in the Borough of Belmar experience an exceptional demand for space during the Belmar & Lake Como St. Patrick's Day Parade (“Parade”), and have requested to use their approved Outdoor Eating Areas temporarily for the day of the Parade which, this year, is on Sunday, March 7, 2010; and,

**WHEREAS**, the Mayor and Council have allowed the use of approved Outdoor Eating Areas for the day of the Parade on an informal basis in the past and wish to allow the use of these areas this year by a written Resolution, to create uniform conditions and by the use of a written Resolution to ensure the businesses know what the conditions are; and

**WHEREAS**, the Mayor and Council wish to temporarily allow businesses to use approved Outdoor Eating Areas for the day of the Parade only under the conditions set forth below.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Borough of Belmar, County of Monmouth, New Jersey, that businesses may temporarily use approved Outdoor Eating Areas for the day of the Parade only under the following conditions:

1. The Outdoor Eating Area, Outdoor Dining Area, or Sidewalk Dining Area (“Outdoor Eating Areas”) must have received the appropriate approvals from the Belmar Planning Board or Zoning Board of Adjustment (“Board”).
2. The business must comply with all Board conditions on the use of the Outdoor Eating Area.
3. The business may not set-up their Outdoor Eating Areas before noon on Saturday, February 27, 2010 and the Outdoor Eating Areas shall be closed down and cleaned up not later than noon on Monday, March 8, 2010.
4. Businesses without a Liquor License shall not permit the consumption of alcoholic beverages by individuals bringing their own alcoholic beverages, known as “BYOB,” in the Outdoor Eating Area. These businesses shall provide sufficient staff to ensure no violations of this condition occurs, violations will result in the issuance of summonses.
5. Businesses with a current, valid Liquor License shall not permit the service or consumption of alcoholic beverages in the Outdoor Eating Areas. These businesses shall provide sufficient staff to ensure no violations of this condition occurs, violations will result in the issuance of summonses and/or Alcoholic Beverage Control charges.
6. Any business which violates these conditions and/or Board conditions on the use of the Outdoor Eating Area during the Parade, may upon Order of the Chief of Police or his designee, have their Outdoor Eating Area immediately shut down, and all persons shall vacate the Outdoor Eating Area.

ORDINANCE AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING  
CHAPTER XVI POLICE REGULATIONS,  
SECTION 16-14.4 PERMITS AND SPECIAL EVENTS PERMITS  
OF THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF  
THE BOROUGH OF BELMAR, IN THE COUNTY OF MONMOUTH, NEW JERSEY

WHEREAS, the Borough of Belmar wished to amend its Ordinances to clarify the definition of a "block party" for a Special Events permit.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough of Belmar, County of Monmouth, New Jersey, that Chapter XVI Police Regulations of the Borough of Belmar Revised General Ordinances is hereby amended and supplemented as follows:

Section I. Chapter XVI Police Regulations is hereby amended and supplemented as follows:

16-14 REGULATION OF CONDUCT IN PUBLIC PARKS, RECREATION AREAS OR ANY OTHER PUBLIC PROPERTY.

16-14.4 Permits and Special Events Permits.

A person or organization desiring to hold any concert, race, walkathon, fair, carnival, festival, celebration, show, block party or other similar event in or upon any public grounds or private property, park, beach or road of the Borough, must first apply for and obtain a permit from the Borough Clerk in accordance with the requirements of subparagraph a of this section. Any such concert, race, walkathon, fair, carnival, festival, celebration, show, block party or other similar event, which is likely to require the expenditure of Borough resources in the form of Department of Public Safety and/or Department of Public Works salaries, wages or other expense, shall constitute a "Special Event." To obtain a permit for a special event, the applicant shall also satisfy the requirements of subparagraph b of this section.

c. Standards.

1. The standards for the issuance of a permit pursuant to this section shall include the following findings:

(f) That a block party, or any similar event by whatever name employed, is only open to the residents of a block or neighborhood and their invited guests, and where the purpose of the event is to promote a sense of community among the residents of a block or neighborhood. As part of the application for a block party, the organizers shall: provide a

signature list with names and addresses of at least 50% of the properties on the block/neighborhood supporting the application; and if approved a plan to provide sufficient advanced notice to neighboring blocks, and where all other requirements of this section have been met subject to the review and approval of the Special Events Committee and the Borough Council.

**SECTION II.** If any section, paragraph, subdivision, clause or provision of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid, such adjudication shall apply only to the section, paragraph, subdivision, clause or provision so adjudged and the remainder of the Ordinance shall be deemed valid and effective.

**SECTION III.** All Ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with or in conflict with the ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

**SECTION IV.** This Ordinance shall take effect 20 days after final passage, adoption and publication according to law.

Council member Wright asked to amend the wording in paragraph f to state that signatures must be obtained by 50% of the properties affected. Mr. Kemm stated he would amend the ordinance.

Council member Wright made a motion to offer amended Ordinance 2010-01 for first reading and schedule it for public hearing on March 3, 2010.

Seconded by Mayor Pringle and approved by the following vote:

**PUBLIC:**

Dirk Reitsma, 1316 Main Street, complimented DPW for doing a good job with snow removal, however it was hindered by the public. He suggested that the alternate side parking rules be adopted into an ordinance and that tickets be issued or vehicles towed for those that don't comply. Mayor Pringle agreed that an ordinance needs to be drafted. Lieutenant Huisman stated he has been speaking to Captain Palmisano about the issue and are working on some ideas. Jean Folker suggested the information be published so that those that are not registered with Code Red are aware of it. She further suggested the ordinance include rules for absentee owners.

Neil Scheck, 410 Fourth Avenue, stated years ago there was a hotline for teenagers who wanted to shovel snow and suggested that be looked into again.

Pat Tecza, Nostalgic Nonsense, commended DPW and stated Belmar did a better job removing snow than other towns. She suggested that a policy be set for trash removal during a snowstorm for businesses. She stated several businesses put their trash out and it is now covered under two feet of snow. Ms. Kirk suggested adding the businesses into the Code Red system.

David Schneck, C Street, asked if the Council ever considered running the marina as a separate corporation to see a profit/loss ratio. Mayor Pringle stated they would have to create a separate utility but it would cost money to do that. Ms. Kirk and Council member Wright stated one could be prepared.

Joan Corallo, A Street, stated there was an article in the Coast Star that stated Manasquan

was charging the purchase of a police car to the beach utility and asked why we don't do that. Ms. Kirk explained that a portion of the vehicle maintenance is already charged to the beach utility.

**ADJOURN:** Mayor Pringle closed the public session and adjourned the regular meeting, which was seconded by Council member Wright and approved unanimously.
